OVERVIEW

Mary manages all phases of litigation, from inception through resolution, including initial case intake and assessment, investigation, substantive motion practice, discovery and depositions, alternative dispute resolution, trial, and appeals. She regularly appears in federal and state courts throughout Pennsylvania, as well as before the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission.

Mary represents individuals, small businesses, and corporations in commercial litigation matters involving contract disputes, fraud, unjust enrichment, fiduciary duty claims, and other complex business conflicts. Her employment practice includes matters involving discrimination, harassment, retaliation, termination, contract negotiation and enforcement, wage disputes, and trade secret theft. She also drafts and advises on severance, non-compete, and confidentiality agreements, and counsels employers on best practices for complying with federal and state regulations in employee manuals, policies, and procedures.

Mary and her classmates organized a fundraising event for the benefit of refugees and immigrants in Western Pennsylvania that was awarded the 2025 Service to the Public Award by the American Bar Association.

- As second-chair in a week-long jury trial involving commercial real estate, Mary helped secure a successful Motion for Compulsory Nonsuit, resulting in her client's early dismissal from the trial and complete avoidance of a \$5 million dollar jury verdict that was awarded to the plaintiff.
- As second-chair in a three-day evidentiary hearing involving a condominium association, Mary helped obtain a Compulsory Nonsuit, avoiding the appointment of a costly receiver and allowing her client to maintain self-governance.
- Mary has successfully obtained dismissals of several EEOC and PHRC charges of discrimination against employers of all sizes
